PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

“But he [Elijah] himself went a day’s journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die...Then the word of the LORD came to him, saying, “What are you doing here, Elijah?” He answered, “I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken you covenant, thrown down your altar, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone a left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.” He [God] said, “Go out and stand on the mountain before the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by.” Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave.”

1Kings 19: 4, 10-13a

Today I find myself pondering wind, strong and destructive winds. Last night the strong and destructive winds of a tornado once again blew through Wisconsin, this time through the town of Elk Mound and the township of Wheaton leaving behind the chaos of destroyed property. I am sure that many of you reading this know exactly how the people of these towns feel right now.

I am also pondering prophets, people who are called or compelled to call attention to the plights of people. On my mind today is the young Swedish prophet, Greta Thunberg. This committed young lady took the United Nations and all adults, really, to task for failing in our responsibility to be stewards of the Earth ensuring the next generation a planet to live on. She faced extreme criticism, but persevered in her message.

So, now I am pondering messages, messengers, and who it is that we are willing to listen to. Elijah faithfully brought the message of repentance to the Israelites and they responded by seeking to take away his life. After fleeing the wrath of Jezebel and the people of Israel, Elijah is protected and refreshed by angels and then instructed to stand in the presence of the LORD. This holy presence is heralded by a great wind splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces, by an earthquake and fire, and then sheer silence. Elijah encounters God’s holy presence in sheer silence.

Is that where we find God? After the tornado that ripped through our area in July, was it in the silence that God was present? In that silence we could pray and meditate on our response to the storm. In that silence we could take time to consider the warnings about climate change that contribute to these strong, unpredictable, and deadly storms. We could consider some ways we could change our behaviors and habits so that we are better stewards of the environment God created for us to live in and with.

We definitely will consider how to respond and help our brothers and sisters in Christ in Elk Mound and in Wheaton. Let’s think together about ways we can be of service to these neighbors in need.
