- Looking for additional help with palt and additional pies (aiming for 50+ pies)—sold over 260 tickets to palt dinner in 2023.

- Black top cracks will need to be repaired this summer.
- Motion made by Steve Kelch to adjourn the meeting. Second by Lacy Sellent. Meeting adjourned at 8:20pm and closed with the Lord's Prayer.


